## CS 4100, Spring 2008 Assignment 3 GOTO Due March 11, 2008

The GOTO statement has engendered a fair amount of controversy in the computer programming community over the years. To better understand the issues involved, we will proceed as follows:

- 1. Read Dijkstra's letter to the editor of the *Communications of the ACM*, Volume 11, Number 3, March 1968, entitled "Go To Statement Considered Harmful."
- 2. In a group of 3-4 students:
  - a. Outline Dijkstra's arguments.
  - b. Discuss the arguments and decide if you agree or disagree.
  - c. Discuss how you might expand or rebut each point.
  - d. The outline with indications of agreement or disagreement is to be handed in at the end of class.

## 3. On your own:

- a. Read at least one other source from our course Blackboard page.
- b. Write a short essay discussing Dijkstra's arguments. If you agree, provide addition support; if you disagree, provide support for your rebuttal. This essay is due at the beginning of class on March 11<sup>th</sup>.
